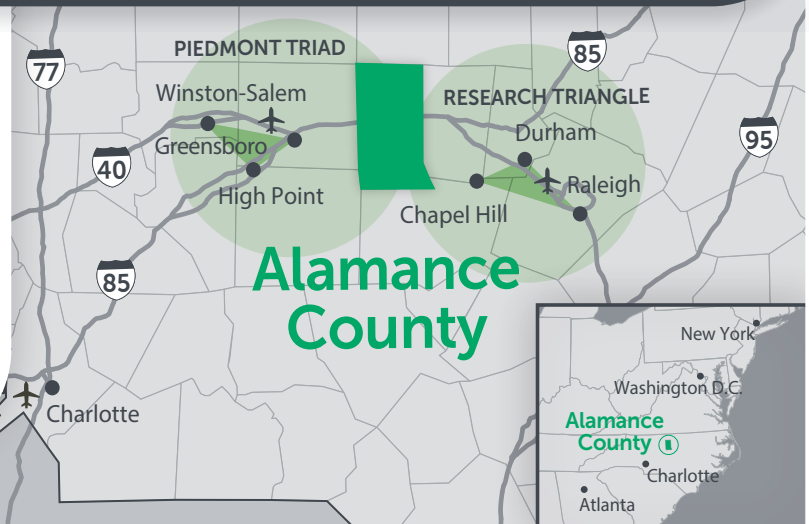
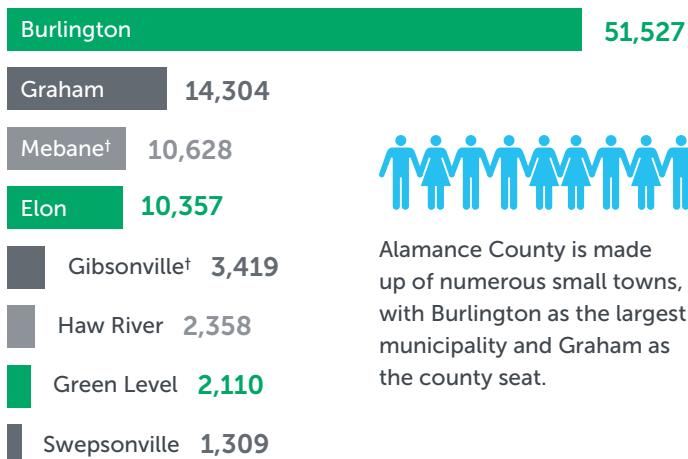


Alamance at a Glance

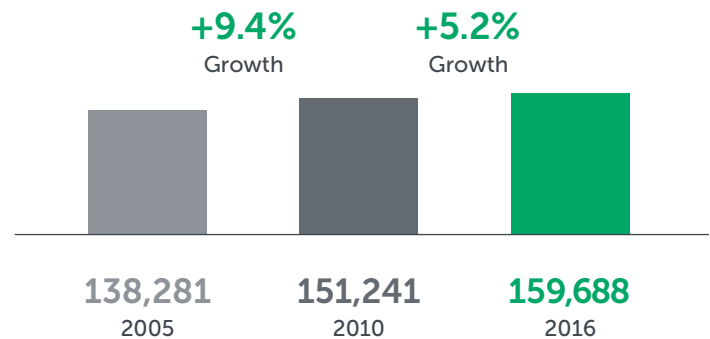
MUNICIPAL POPULATIONS



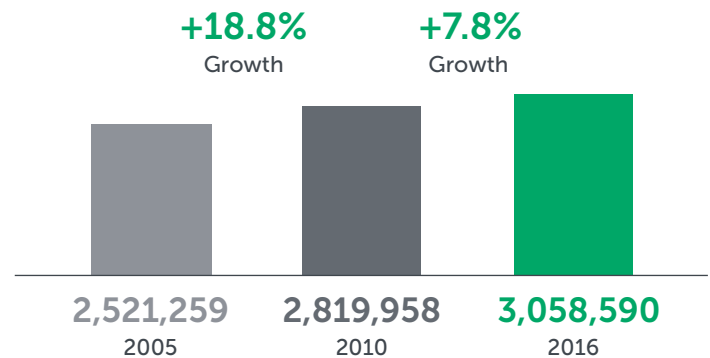
Alamance County is made up of numerous small towns, with Burlington as the largest municipality and Graham as the county seat.

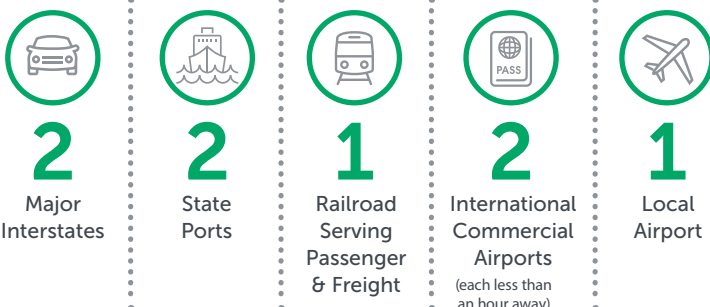


ALAMANCE AREA*

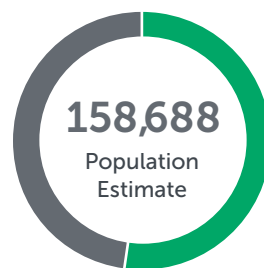

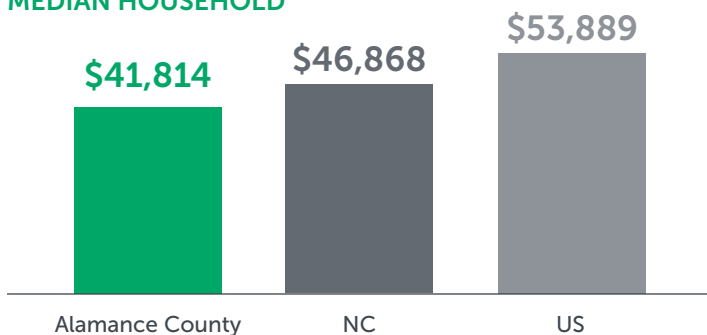

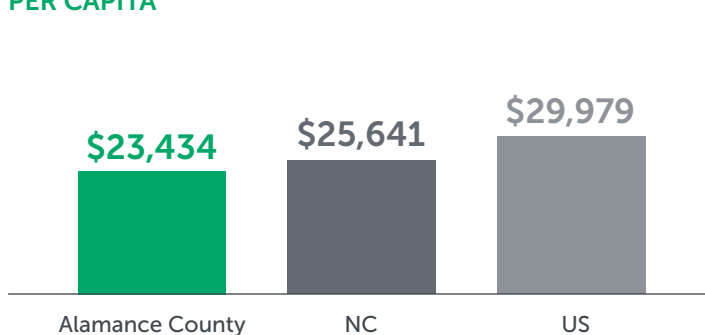
MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD AND PER CAPITA INCOME

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD

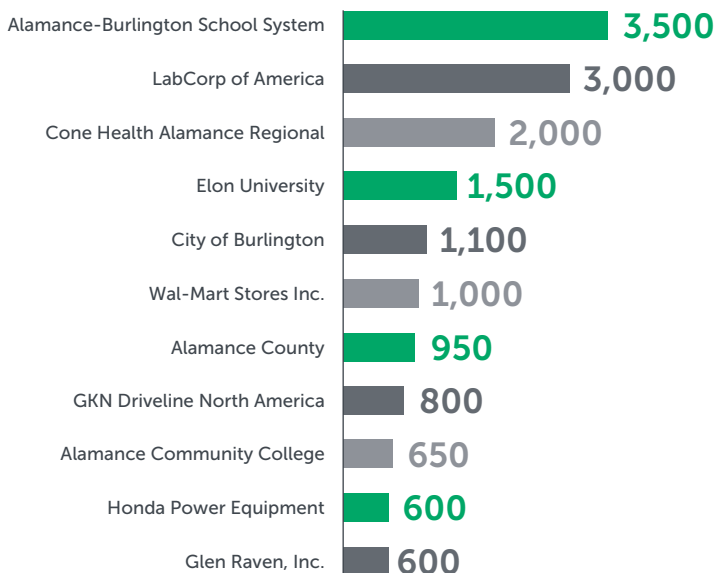

PER CAPITA

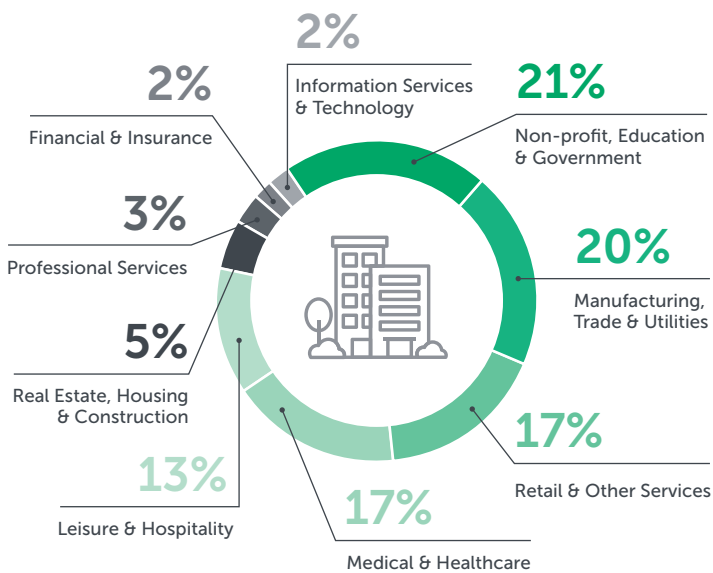


MAJOR EMPLOYERS
