Over 50,000 school supplies were collected last year through the Classroom Collection Campaign. These supplies ensured that more than **3,100 Alamance-Burlington School System students** in need were supplied with the basic tools necessary for a successful school year.

The need in our county continues to rise. Currently, **approximately 60%** of students enrolled in Alamance-Burlington Schools receive free or reduced breakfast/lunch and **10 schools** that provide every student with free breakfast/lunch.
