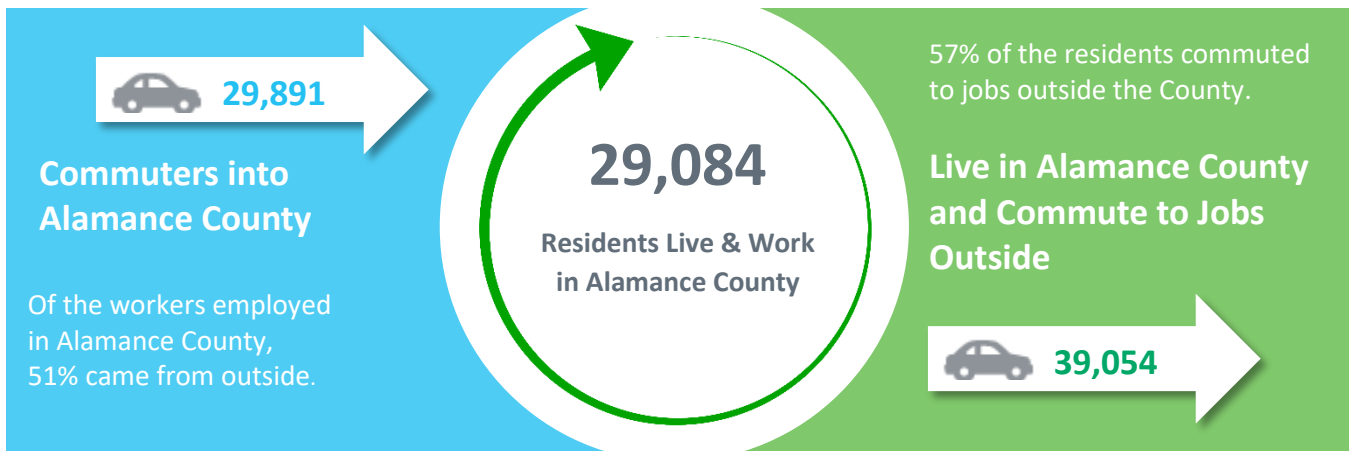




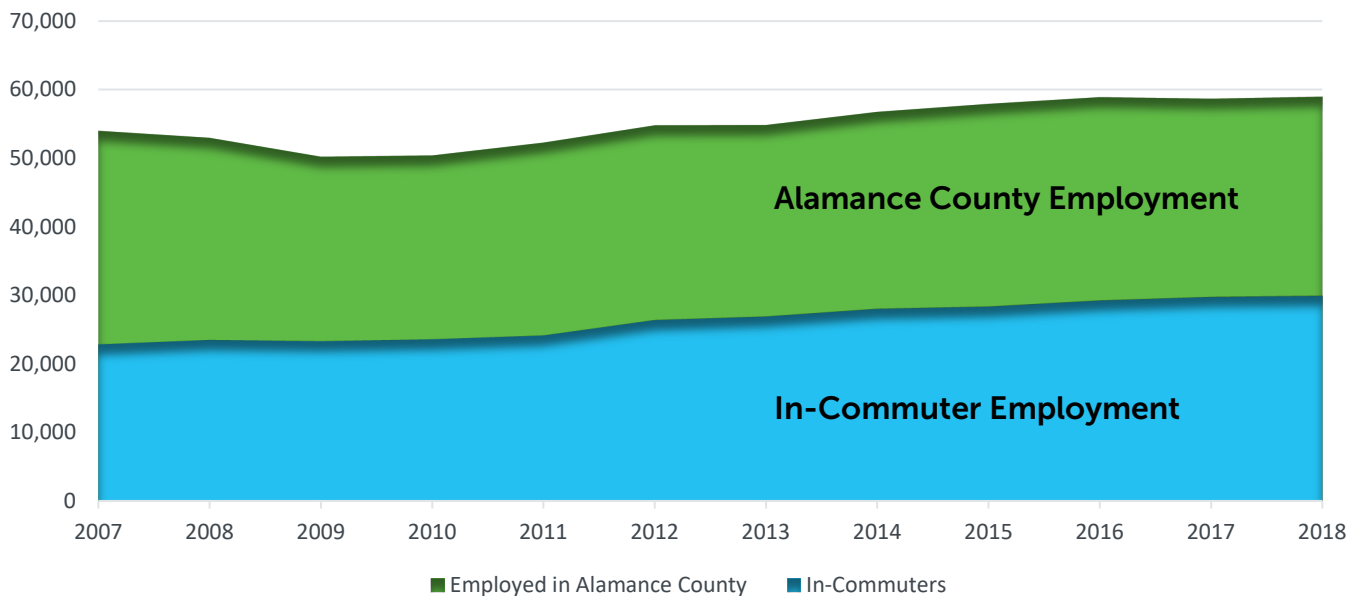
Worker flows help define the size of a local economy’s labor draw, and trends help describe attraction and regional competition. Worker flows represent both daily commuters and short-term, away-from-home assignments (major construction projects, on-site consulting, etc.).

Alamance County serves as an employment center with nearly 30,000 workers commuting to jobs in the County. Located between the Piedmont Triad and Research Triangle Regions, Alamance County pulls in workers from both areas. Of those who live within Alamance County, approximately 29,000 remain in the County for work and 39,000 leave for their primary job.

2018 Commuting Patterns in Alamance County, NC

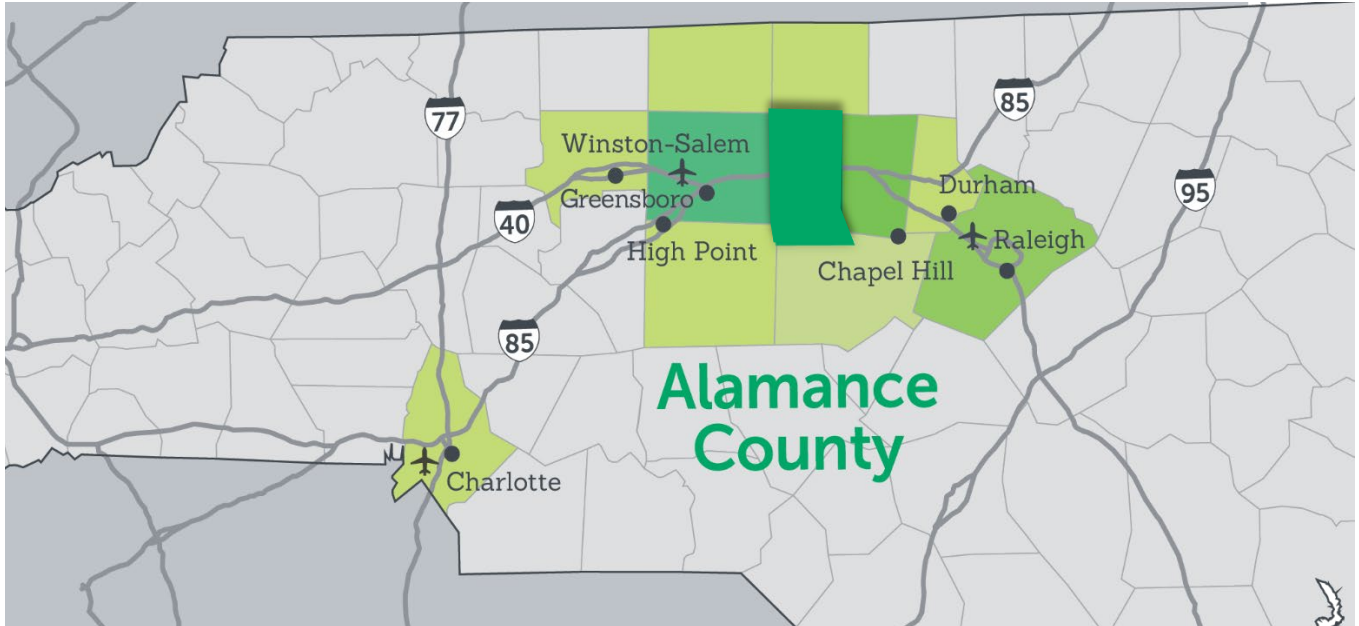


2007-2018 Alamance County Commuting Trends

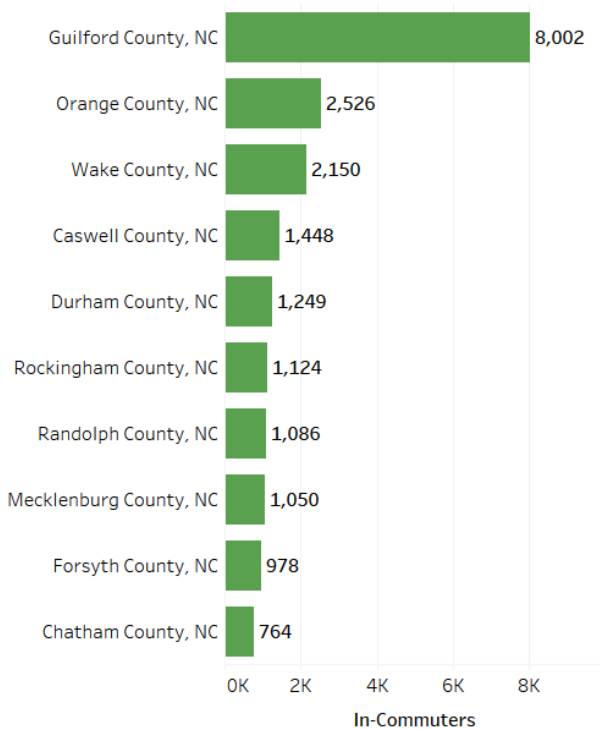

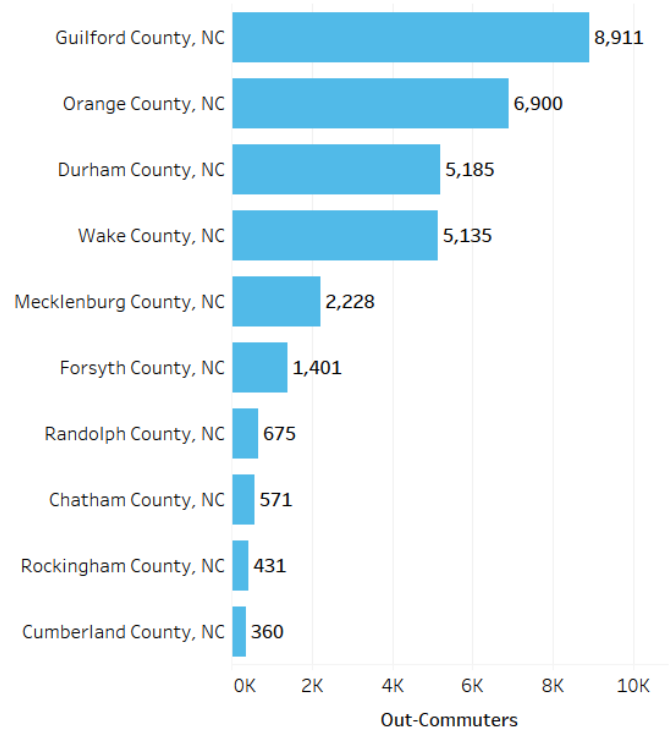
Top 10 In-Commuter Counties Commuting to Alamance County for Work, 2018
